



Key Points

- Time of attack




Timeline of Key Events








Orientation to Abbey Gate






Flow at Abbey Gate 20 – 26 AUG 21





















Large and Unruly Crowds at Abbey Gate 25AUG21




Post-Blast UAS Footage at Abbey Gate ~261740AUG21






Blast Analysis





Blast Site Orientation








No Complex Attack

• **BLUF**: There was no complex attack; it was a single attacker not accompanied by enemy small arms fire.

Supporting Facts:

- Only one explosion
- Leaders unanimously agree – no complex attack
- Effects of fog and friction
 - Uncertainty
 - Blast effects
 - CS gas
 - Warning shots





Medical Capabilities

- **BLUF**: The wounds sustained by the KIA were so catastrophic that none could be saved.
- Supporting Facts:
 - Catastrophic wounds
 - Most KIA arrived at hospital deceased or expectant
 - Effective triage
 - Robust capability
 - 9 surgical teams.
 - STP and enroute care team saved lives
 - Providers and examiners agree that wounds of KIA were too catastrophic to save.
 - Trauma Surgeon "...not even at Bagram did we have that many surgical teams, and we had plenty of whole blood."
 - Surgeon, "We had orthopedic, trauma, critical care, general surgery, O-5 and above in charge of those sections." "Would it have mattered if we had more Class VIII or personnel? No, because we had all we needed. Did we need more people? No, we had a lot of experience on the team and plenty of people."
 - Every Service Member that could be was saved.
